6. School Projects Inman Elementary School

The committee reviewed a request from Inman Elementary School to place a Big Brothers donation bin on the school grounds. Although this would be a fundraiser for the school, staff expressed a number of concerns. The committee discussed the request in detail and agreed to recommend that the placement of donation bins on school grounds be denied at this time.

Recommendation: THAT the Board of Education deny the request for the placement of a Big Brothers donation bin on the grounds of Inman Elementary School.

7. Kinder Morgan Consent to Survey Request

Mr. Frank informed the committee that Kinder Morgan is in the planning process for a new pipeline. As part of that process, the company is investigating a 150-metre-wide study area along the existing pipeline, a portion of which touches the northeast corner of the Duthie-Union school site. All property owners along the existing pipeline have been asked to sign a Consent to Survey form so that on-site conditions of the property may be further investigated during the planning process. The pipeline project has yet to be approved and this is not an endorsement of the project.

The committee agreed to recommend that the survey request be approved.

Recommendation: THAT the Board of Education approve the consent to survey request by Kinder Morgan, as presented.
