## 1. Pink Shirt Day

February 24, 2021, is Pink Shirt Day in B.C. The aim of Pink Shirt Day is to raise awareness of bullying in schools, workplaces and communities, both in-person and online. Also known as Anti-Bullying Day, Pink Shirt Day is a day when everyone is encouraged to practice kindness, and students and staff wear a pink shirt to symbolize a stand against bullying.

Many schools across the district are finding creative ways to celebrate unique differences and spread kindness throughout the community.

Students and staff at Alpha Secondary School are no exception. Alpha's *Theatre Production* class set out to create Public Service Announcements – something a little bit different from the typical ones that might be seen, and more reflective of their personal experiences with bullying. Students believe that bullying has changed over the years and want to showcase the subtle and quiet "face" of bullying so that it is recognizable.

This evening, Tim Wozney, Principal at Alpha Secondary School, is joined by Cristina McAllister, Visual and Performing Arts Department Head and Drama Teacher, and students Sage Fleming (grade 11), Emma Torrao (grade 11), and Danika Jones (grade 12).
